## Appendix 2

### Note

1. Name and Date Patents were originally unnumbered. They are assigned X numbers, in the sequence in which they were issued, for data control. Over 11,000 patents were issued between 1790 and July 4, 1836.
2. Note that some numbers within a series may be unused or fractionalized. Therefore, the number of patents granted during a year cannot be determined by simply subtracting the number of the first patent issued in one year from the number of the first patent issued in the next year.
3. Mechanical, electrical and chemical patents issued, which are frequently designated as “utility” patents, are included in this document set. The first patent, beginning with the number “1”, in this series was issued on July 13, 1836.
4. Design Patent from number “D1”, issued in 1842, through number 21,442, issued in March 1892, were microfilmed.
5. Reissue patents are issued to correct a previously issued patent. Reissue patents begin a separate number series beginning with “RE”. Reissued Design patents use the same series but begin with “RD”. Reissue patents were not separately numbered until 1838. Reissue Patents are a part of the *CDR File™/Patent Status File™* starting in 1973.
6. Plant patent images on paper and microfiche are in color, images in DVD are not in color. Plant patents are issued using “PP” number series.
7. The first Published Application, also known as Pre-Grant Publication, was on March 15, 2001.
8. Defensive publications were issued under the “T” number series. The “T” number comprises 3 or 4 digits for the *Official Gazette* volume number plus 3 or 2 digits for the number series of Defensive Publications in that volume.
9. Prior to December 1969, Defensive Publication documents were assigned to a numbering system which was based on the application number assigned at the time of receipt at the Patent and Trademark Office. A conversion table for translating Defensive Publications, issued prior to December 16, 1969, to the new numbering system appears in the *Official Gazette* of December 16, 1969, vol. 869, pages 687 to 688.
10. Defensive Publications have been replaced by Statutory Invention Registrations (SIRs). The PTO stopped accepting Defensive Publications effective May 8, 1985, the last of which was to be published by June 24, 1986. Defensive Publication T109,201 was July 5, 1988.
11. First issued on December 3, 1985 under the “H” number series. Effective May 8, 1985, the USPTO began accepting Statutory Invention Registrations (SIRs) and stopped accepting Defensive Publications, which SIRs replace.
12. December 29, 1981. Reexamination Certificates are a part of the *CDR File™/Patent Status File™*. The “B number” comprises a sequentially numbered prefix (B1, B2, etc.) for successive Reexamination Certificates for a patent plus, the patent number for that patent as originally issued. Effective January 2, 2001 the code for reexamination certificates changed to C1, C2, C3, etc. For example, US 6,543,210 C1.
13. Corrections, Disclaimers, Reissues. The *CDR File™* microfilm and cumulative printed paper index to it was continued as the *Patent Status File™* in 1987. Title varies as *CDR File™* or *Patent Status File™*.
14. *Official Gazette – Patents* final paper edition was last published on September 24, 2002, Vol. 1262, No. 4.
15. Microfiche in ASI collection. (accession number 2244-1)
16. Reports are available as PDF files on 3 DVD-ROM discs.
17. Title varies.
18. Normally patents which were seized by the Office of the Alien Property Custodian (APC) during World War II that were issued to residents of Axis countries, Bulgaria, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Japan, and Rumania, and Axis-occupied countries, i.e. France, Belgium, etc. Patents were assigned to the Alien Property Custodian or the Attorney General of the United States. Seized patent applications were published in the *Official Gazette* on April 20 and 27; May 4, 11, 18 and 25; June 26; and July 13, 1943. The APC published numerous indexes and catalogs of seized patents and patents applications.

19. *Official Gazette* published as 2 separate issues (*Patents* and *Trademarks*) as of February 2, 1971. Older trademarks are available in the combined *Official Gazette* back to 1872.
20. Also have 1994.
21. *GlobalPat: Text and Drawings from Patent First Pages* contains text and a drawing (where appropriate) from the first page of a representative member of each patent family published by the United States, the European Patent Office and the World Intellectual Property Office. Including patents from Australia; Austria; Belgium; Brazil; Canada; Czechoslovakia; Denmark; Finland; France; Germany (East), Democratic Republic of; Germany (West), Federal Republic of; Great Britain; Hungary; Israel; Italy; Japan; Luxembourg; Netherlands; Norway; Portugal; Romania; South Africa; Spain; Sweden; Switzerland; USSR; and other Patent Cooperation Treaty offices. The back file covered 1971-1996; the front file included 1997 and 1998. GlobalPat was a joint product of the European Patent Office and the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. The project was cancelled at the end of 1998.
22. *Patent Abstracts of Japan (PAJ)* on CD-ROM covers published unexamined patent applications (kokai) from 1976-1993 (back file) and 1994 forward (front file). It was distributed to the PTDLs under a reciprocal agreement with the Japan Patent Office. The agreement ended in 2001.
