Hopefully construction will be completed by the end of the year. Until then, be on the lookout for large construction vehicles and please be cautious when proceeding down the access road.

- *Magazine Section chairs and tables



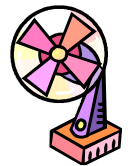
