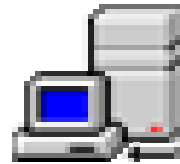

ELECTRONIC DATABASES

You may not have noticed, but the Hawaii State Public Library System provides free electronic databases to help you find information beyond the bookshelves. These can be accessed through our IPAC terminals within the library or at home through the Internet. Just go to our homepage at <http://www.state.hi.us/kaneohepl/> and click on "Electronic Databases." You will need your library card number. Here's a sample of what you can find:

- ◆ **Alt Health Watch**—articles on alternative medicine.
- ◆ **Ancestry Plus** (available only in the library) - very helpful for genealogy searches.
- ◆ **Auto Repair Reference Manual**—repair and maintenance information on foreign and domestic vehicles for present and past models.
- ◆ **Biography Resource Center**—biographies on everyone from George Washington to P. Diddy.
- ◆ **Business and Company Resource Center**—information and research articles on businesses, products, and corporations.
- ◆ **CQ Weekly**—current information and articles on government and legislative activities.
- ◆ **EBSCO Animals**—pictures, facts & articles about animals.
- ◆ **Health Source**—current articles on health-related issues.
- ◆ **Masterfile Premier**— articles from most popular magazines and journals, including *Newsweek*, *People*, & *Time*.
- ◆ **Novelist**—looking for a fiction book similar to a novel you've read? This is a great place for recommendations.
- ◆ **Testing and Education Reference Center**—helpful practice tests and listings of colleges and graduate schools.
- ◆ **World Book Online**—all of the articles in the encyclopedia set are available here



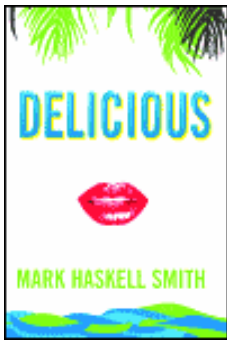
